Eton College believes in providing an all-round education for our pupils, involving them in a deep commitment to the full co-curriculum. Sport has been central to the Eton curriculum for some time – the first ever recorded inter-school fixture is an Eton v Westminster cricket match in 1796; amateur rowing was established here, and the Eton Field Game trophy is even older than the FA Cup! Today we provide organised sport on six afternoons per week.

As a Resident Sport Assistant living at Eton, you will have the opportunity to gain experience across all aspects of the school, but your primary activities will be assisting our extensive co-curricular sport programme. Alongside this you will work with our Summer School programme, help the school deliver our annual calendar of events, and perform House Assistant duties within two of our Boarding Houses.

In return, we offer a comprehensive benefits package including free accommodation on site,

subsidised meals, a range of other additional employee discounts and opportunities for personal development, such as the opportunity to undertake a number of coaching qualifications during your time at Eton. Previous Sport Assistants have gone on to achieve successful careers in sport, coaching and teaching.

This two year opportunity is for anyone with a passion for sport and the ability to convey this enthusiasm to young people. Along with excellent social skills, you will need natural coaching abilities, an open mind to consider and value the perspective of others, and the desire and dedication to make a difference to young people's lives through sport. As one recent Sport Assistant stated, "The Graduate Assistant role has exceeded my expectations providing me with exposure to all aspects of school life whether that be academic, co-curricular or the boarding environment where I've had very positive interactions with staff and pupils."

SPORT AT ETON

Life at Eton is vibrant, varied, exciting, challenging and immensely rewarding – for pupils and staff alike.

The school was founded by Henry VI in 1440, and is today the largest boys' boarding school in the UK. In keeping with the charitable intentions of our founder, we welcome pupils from all backgrounds. This year pupils joined us from over 120 different schools from across the country and 10% of pupils come from overseas.

Today's school is a forward-thinking and increasingly diverse community. Inclusivity, development and innovation in teaching and learning are our guiding values. We are a modern, forward-thinking school, always seeking to work at the forefront of developments in teaching and learning.

Our aim is to offer opportunities for every student to take part in and learn through sport. Our co-curricular programme is designed to encourage a rich and diverse experience for all pupils, enabling pupils to identify and develop skills and strengths outside the classroom, through a huge variety of activities including sport, societies, outdoor education, arts, music and theatre.

Every boy is offered a full sporting programme and almost all members of the teaching staff are involved in delivering sport in some form or other. Opportunity is key: pupils play for school teams and in house competitions for all major sports teams including football, rugby, hockey and cricket, as well as a broad array of other sports such as fencing, squash, rackets, martial arts and water polo.

Games are central to Eton's curriculum, not just because pupils enjoy them, but because they help to develop many of the qualities in which the school believes. On some match days, there may be as many as 50 games being played, including Eton's original football games, such as the Wall Game and the Field Game. Eton Fives is another 'original' sport; although other versions of Fives have been developed and now the game is played nationally and internationally by many schools and clubs; with current Eton pupils making very good use of our 16 courts.

Whilst pupils enjoy playing sport in their own right, the process of engaging in sport at Eton also embodies many qualities promoted by the College, such as learning to win and lose; to push oneself to, and perhaps beyond, one's perceived limits; to think as part of a team; to know when to strive for more and when to acknowledge defeat. Consequently, we aim to give every pupil the chance to benefit from learning through sport by playing, improving and enjoying the sport of their choice.

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CARING FOR OUR PUPILS

The school provides outstanding pastoral care for pupils. We are a full boarding school with 25 boarding houses, each home to around 55 pupils aged 13-18. The houses are the heart of life at Eton.

Each house is run by a dedicated team, including a House Master and Dame who live on-site and a team of support staff. Each house is also supported by teaching staff members, who carry out regular evening duties as a House Assistant.

Pupils are also tutored in small groups by a dedicated Tutor, who meets with them regularly and takes an interest in their academic progress and well-being.

We care about the individual and pride ourselves on the warmth of a community in which all our pupils feel valued.

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

- Contributing to the school's sport programme, taking responsibility for a sport team or teams each half (term), providing coaching, supervision and guidance, and accompanying away matches against other schools;
- Coaching and co-coaching training sessions;
- Officiating sport matches;
- Under the direction of the House Master, performing weekly House Assistant duties within two of the school's boarding houses;
- Participating in informal duties across the college, such as society meetings, contributing to the school's 'socials' programme and acting as an exam invigilator;
- Providing logistical and administrative support to the Lower Master's Office and Events Manager during major events, including (but not limited to), the school's two major open days, Parent-Teacher meetings, and supervision of transport during the start and end of school holidays;
- Working with the Summer Schools team to help deliver our Summer Schools' programme;
- Contributing to other areas of the co-curriculum, subject to individual aptitude, experience and preferences, and as approved by the Director of School Sport;
- Participating in the outdoor education programme including participation in outdoor trips;
- Undertaking any other reasonable tasks as requested.

FURTHER ACTIVITIES

Some Sport Assistants may also:

- Undertake some academic 'team teaching' with an experienced Master;
- Subject to qualifications and prior experience, undertake a small amount of classroom teaching;
- Assist pupils with university applications during the Michaelmas half.

WHATS IN IT FOR ME?

We believe that all our staff deserve the fullest support in achieving their own potential.

All members of our community are encouraged to participate fully in the life of the school and to enjoy the beautiful grounds and facilities. Windsor is just across the river, with a tangle of pretty lanes, chic shopping streets, green spaces, ancient castles and picturesque tea shops. There is plenty to see and do. Windsor also hosts the oldest and largest inhabited castle in the world as well as one of Britain's oldest and most prestigious repertory theatres. 20 miles of beautiful and historic waterway meanders through the Royal Borough of Windsor and Maidenhead, leaving historic villages and iconic attractions waiting to be discovered.

PACKAGE DETAILS

Offering a competitive salary of £19,352.64 per annum and free accommodation*, this is a 2 year fixed-term contract, starting in September 2022 and ending in August 2024.

* Whilst the accommodation is provided free of charge, there will be a small personal tax liability for you on this benefit. Please be aware, the accommodation is similar to a Halls of Residence and is only suitable for a single person or a couple. Alternative accommodation is not available.

The working pattern is 6 days a week (Monday to Saturday inclusive), and approximately 40 hours per week. During Summer Schools, you will work for approximately 40 hours per week, however the days and hours of work will vary depending on the activities you are performing at the time.

You will be expected to work for 40 weeks per year, with 5.6 weeks paid holiday. This means you will be paid for 45.6 weeks in total. The remaining 6.4 weeks are considered unpaid leave, however you will be paid monthly over 12 months.

You will be required to take your annual leave during non-term periods, excluding the 3 days before the start of term and the three days after the end of term, and the 6 weeks of Summer schools – which normally run from early July to Mid-August. If a bank holiday falls during term time this is considered a normal working day, and you will receive a day's holiday in lieu.

Any offers will also be subject to a number of pre-employment checks that must be satisfactory to the College. The Eton College HR department will contact the successful candidates to discuss this further at the relevant time.

Eton College is committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children, and applicants must be willing to undergo safeguarding checks, including, but not limited to; reference checks with past employers and an Enhanced Disclosure from the DBS. The College is exempt from the Rehabilitation of Offenders Act 1974 and therefore all convictions, cautions, reprimands and final warnings (including those which would normally be considered as "spent" under the Act) must be declared, subject to the DBS filtering rules. It is a criminal offence for any person who is barred from working with children to attempt to apply for a position at the College.

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Throughout the recruitment process, The HR and Recruitment team have been fantastic in making sure I was up-to-date on paperwork and safeguarding checks.
